

Foreclosures Increasing in Number

There were 3.8 million foreclosures in 2010, up 2% from 2009; an increase of 23% from 2008, according to RealtyTrac.

Banks Under Investigation

Bank of America, Wells Fargo, and other giant banks are under investigation for robosigning, fraudulent documents, and predatory lending leading to foreclosure.
